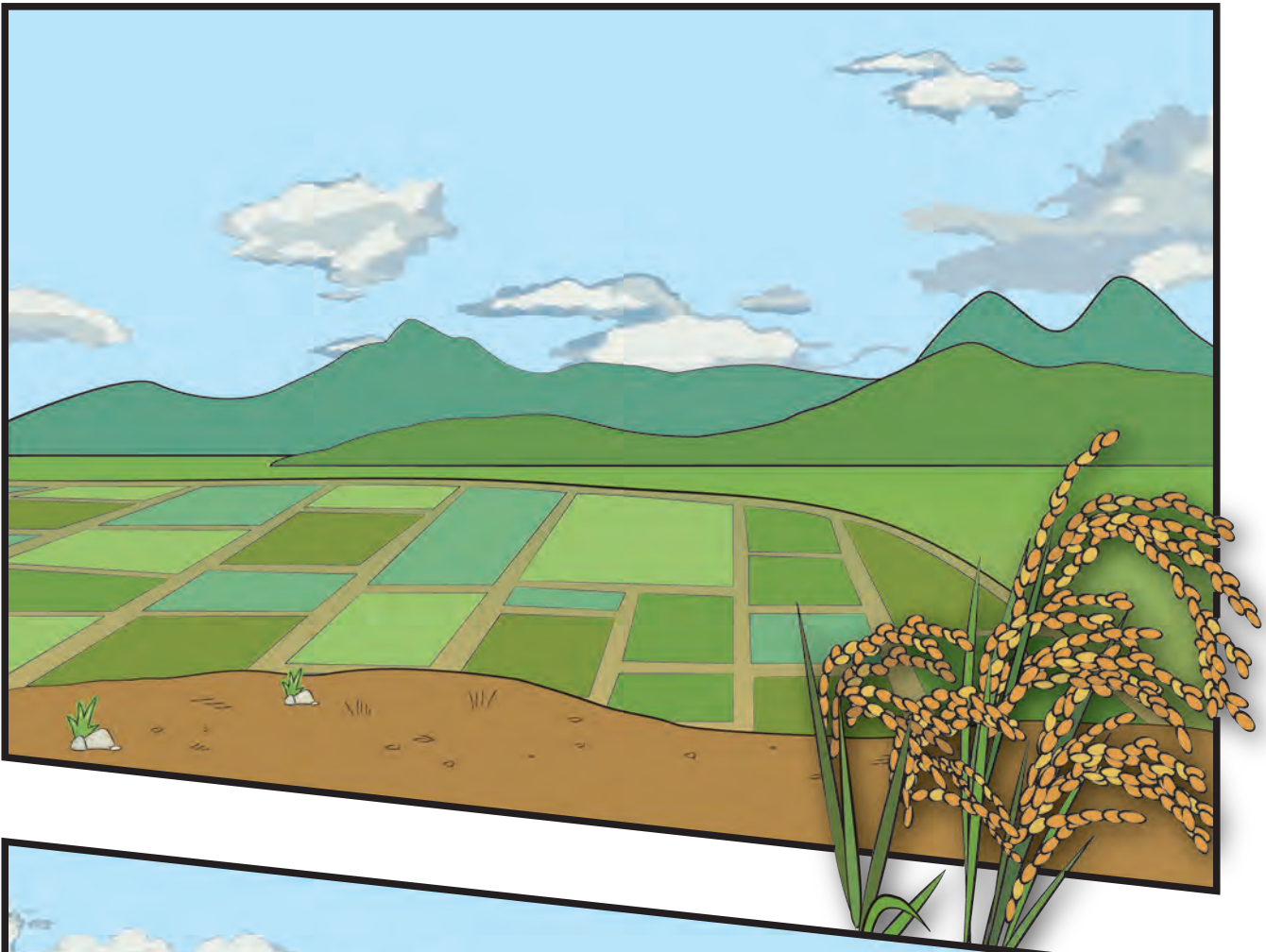


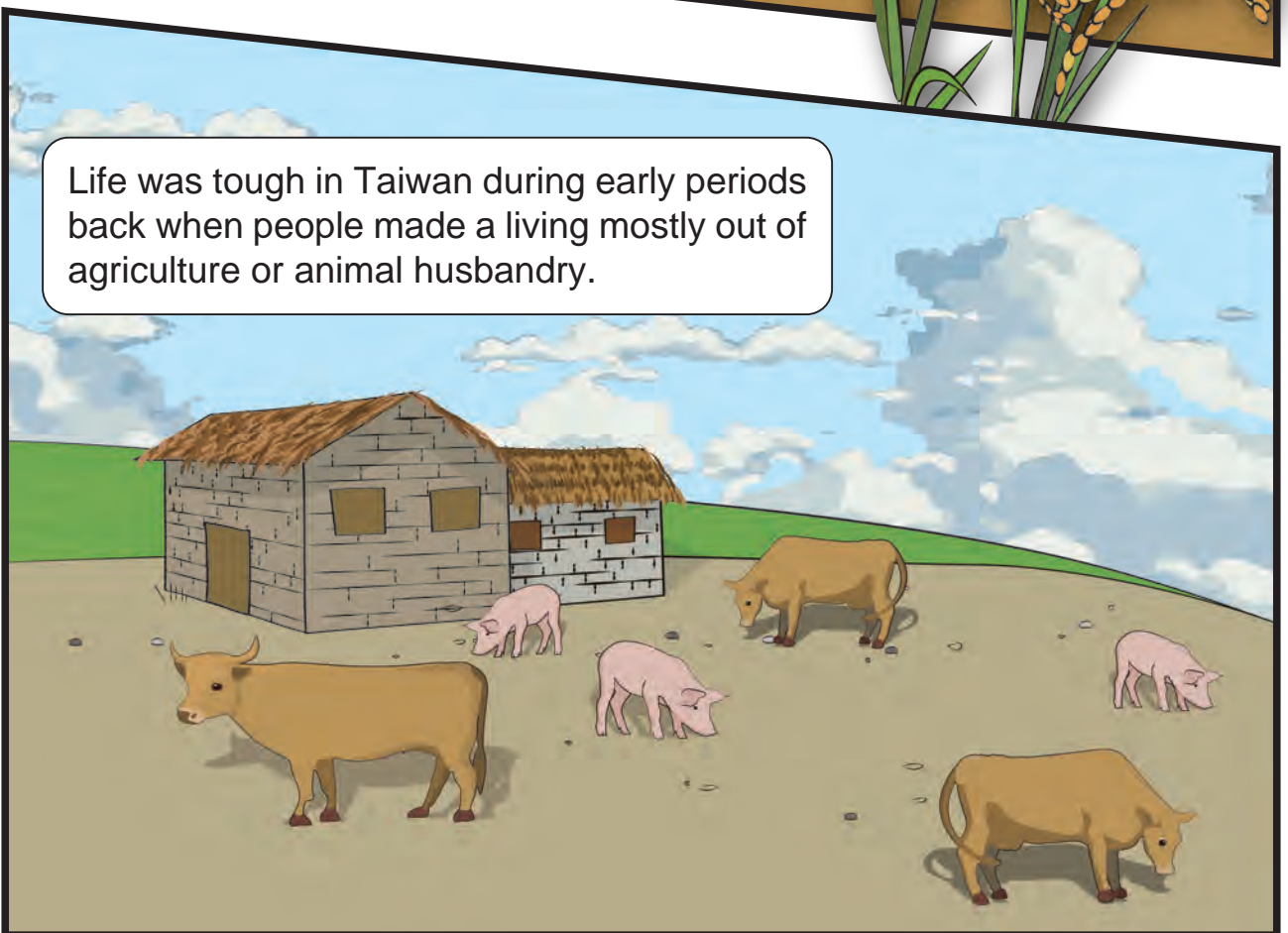


*The wisdom of FPG's grandma
from growing vegetables*





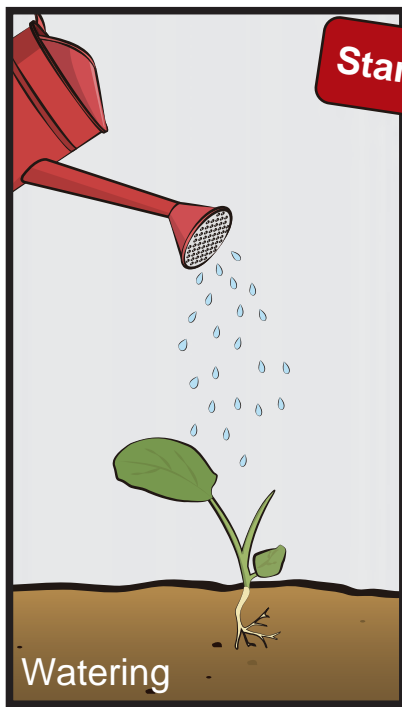
Life was tough in Taiwan during early periods back when people made a living mostly out of agriculture or animal husbandry.

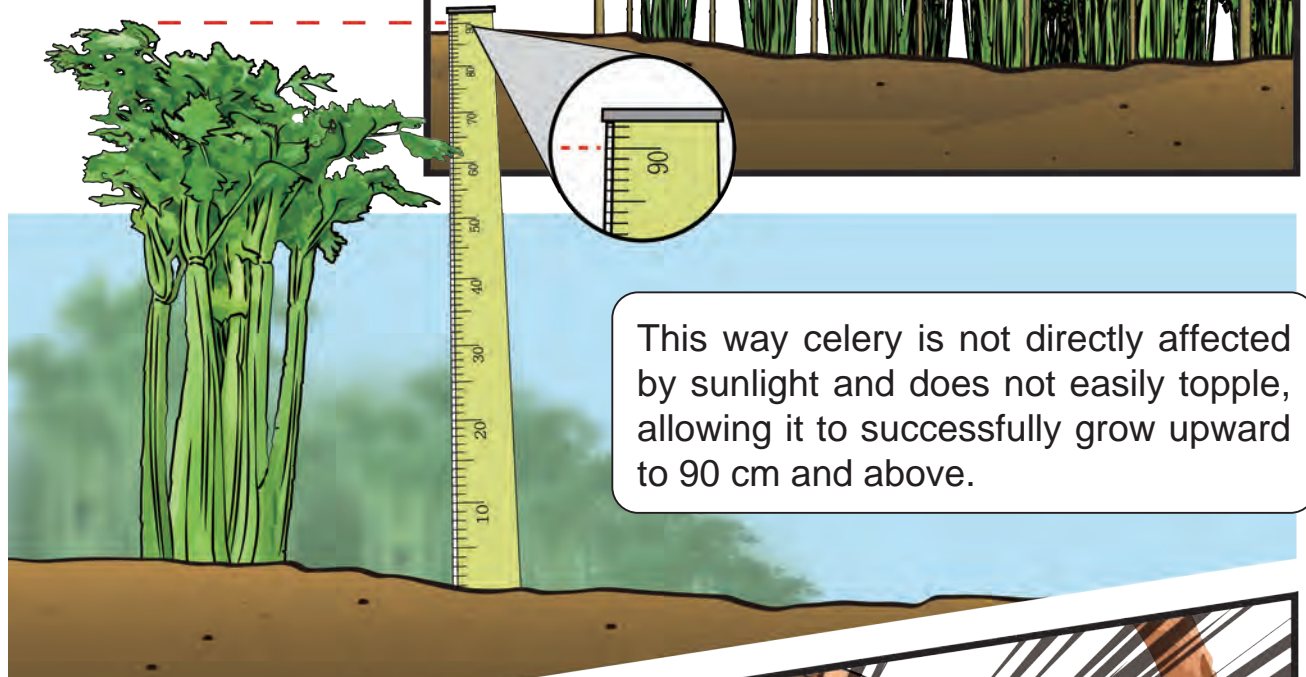


Since farmland was hard to come by and the harvest was for covering household expenses, she gave it extra thought and her vegetables grew bigger and sold for a better price than others.

Grandma also discovered from her vegetable growing experience that celery grew better and was more tender with less exposure to sunlight,

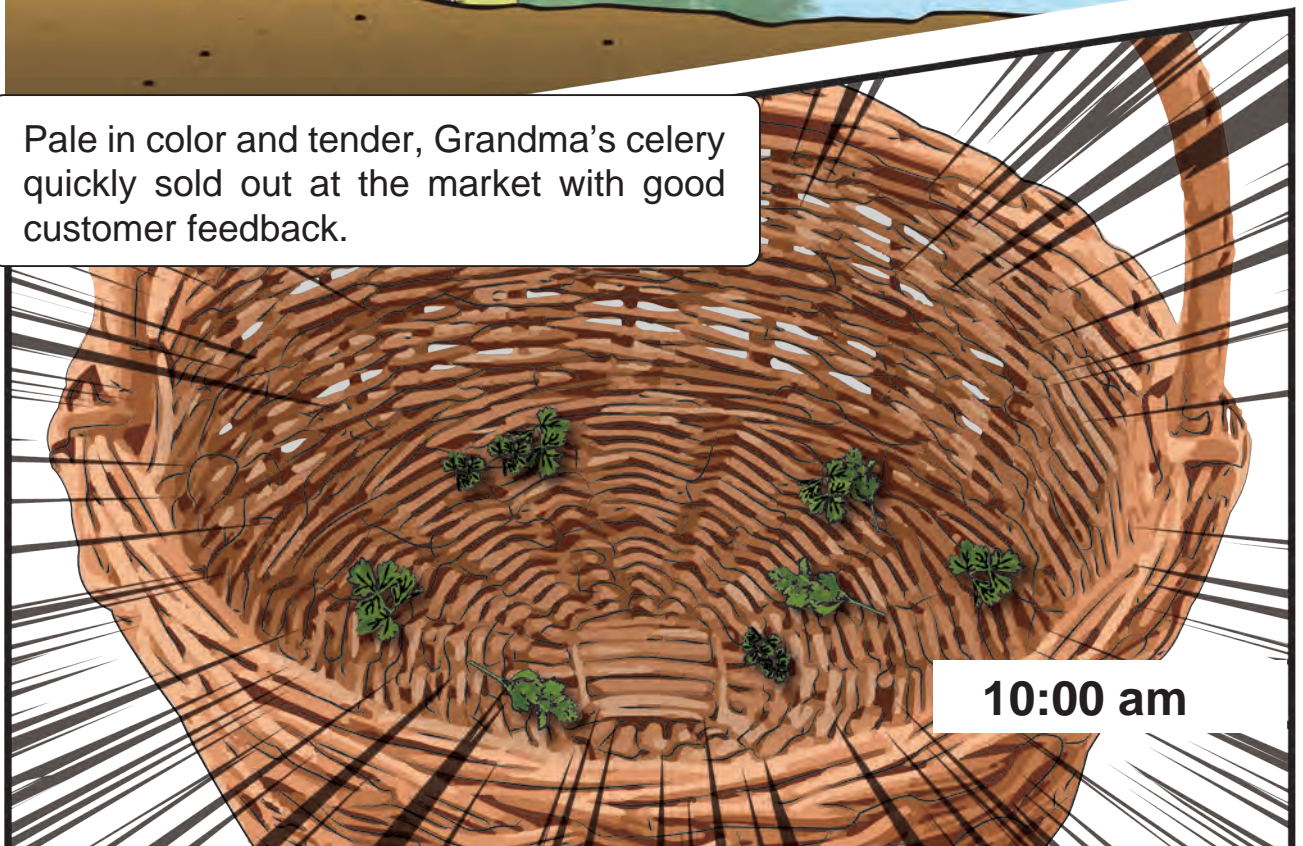


so she built a scaffold from bamboo to block the sun and support the celery stalks as they grew in height.



This way celery is not directly affected by sunlight and does not easily topple, allowing it to successfully grow upward to 90 cm and above.

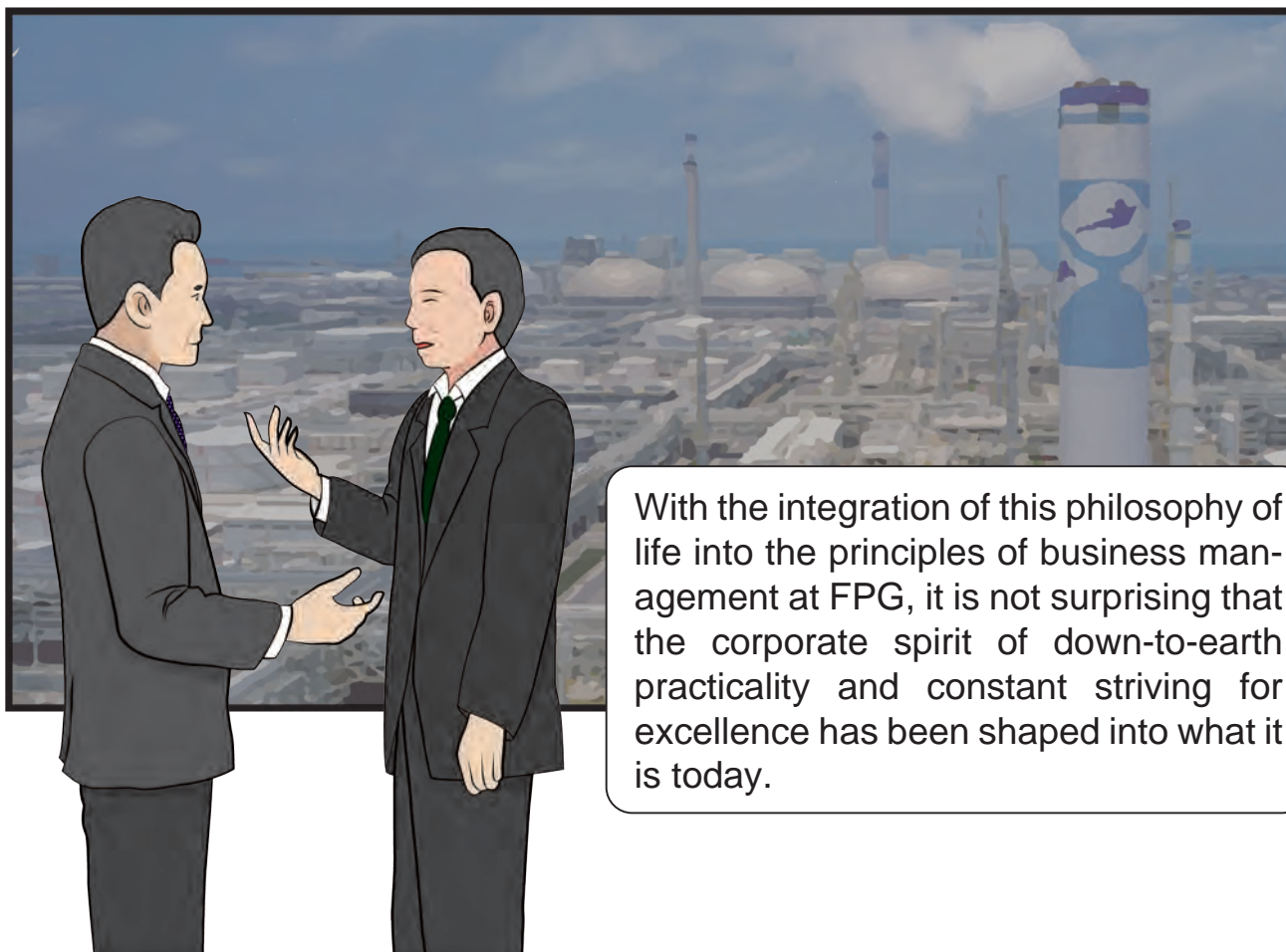
Pale in color and tender, Grandma's celery quickly sold out at the market with good customer feedback.
